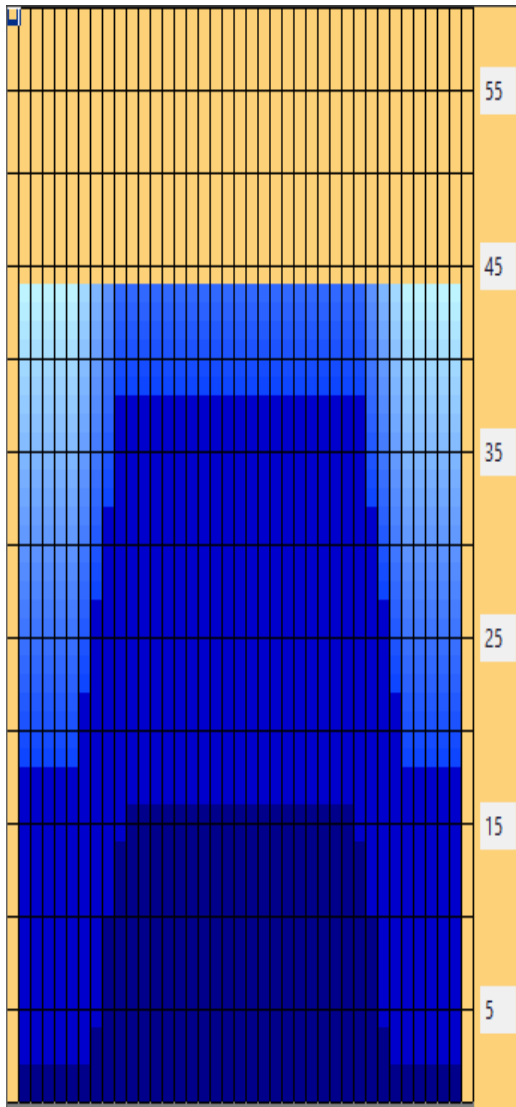

Description: *Long quasi-sport pattern based on a house shot design*

Characteristics: *High volume oil pattern with short back ends*

Recommended Attack Area: *First to second arrow*

Recommended Delivery Speed: *Moderate*

Equipment: *Strong with polished surface*

Scoring Potential: *Medium to High* Difficulty: *Medium*

The EBT Andromeda 44' Pattern is one of the longer EBT proprietary patterns and one of the most popular. At 44 feet in length and being a modified house shot, bowlers will naturally want to play around first to second arrow. While that should play fine, bowlers must be careful of their attack angle. The deeper the angle, the more difficult the pattern. Andromeda has high volumes of oil in the middle boards and is longer than most patterns which will cause an under reaction if bowlers venture too far to the outside by trying to swing it.

Andromeda does allow for multiple attack lines, but bowlers playing deep inside will have the greatest difficulty as that angle is not very forgiving. It is recommended that bowlers throw straight at their spares. Because the pattern does have extra oil in the heads and midlane, look for the likelihood of carry down as the games prolong or you may find yourself *lost in space!* Andromeda does tend to produce higher scores, but do not underestimate this pattern as it is trickier than you might think. Read your lanes and watch the transition! In the end, you as the bowler are ultimately responsible for choosing the right equipment and playing the lanes as they allow you to play them! This is only a reference guide, not an answer key!
