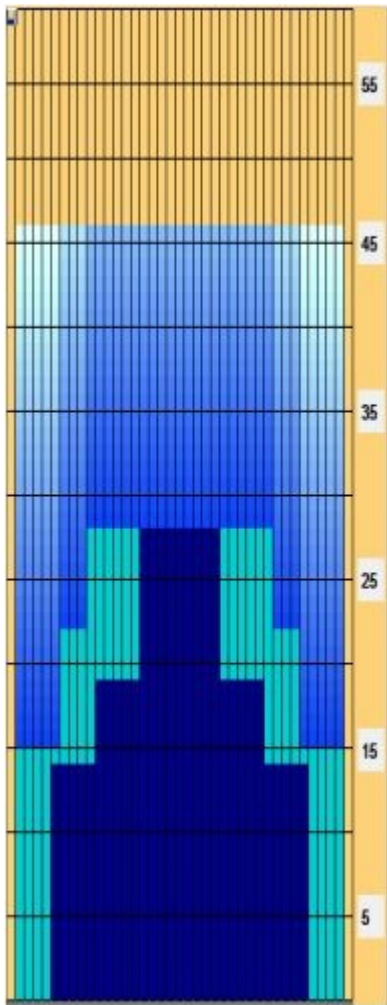


PBA - Mark Roth 46'



Pictured to the left is the overhead graph of the Mark Roth 46' Pattern. This pattern is named after PBA Hall of Famer, Mark Roth. According to the PBA, "...this pattern is designed around today's bowling ball technology using higher conditioner volumes to accommodate the significantly higher rev rates demonstrated by the modern professional as well as the increased lineage per lane bed" (www.pba.com).

This pattern tends to start off oily requiring a smooth ball speed and increased accuracy to your target. A strong surface bowling ball to start off will be recommended. EBT bowlers find that a very tight angle towards the middle boards around 15 to 10, or coming off the outside boards while playing down and in worked best. It is not recommend playing deep inside angles by anyone especially in the beginning when the lanes are fresh. However, like most non-house shot patterns, the middle dries out first followed by an increasingly strong back end resulting in a reverse block as the games prolong. This pattern tends to produce a low to medium scoring pace with an occasional high game, but it receives very favorable reviews from EBT bowlers in both divisions.
