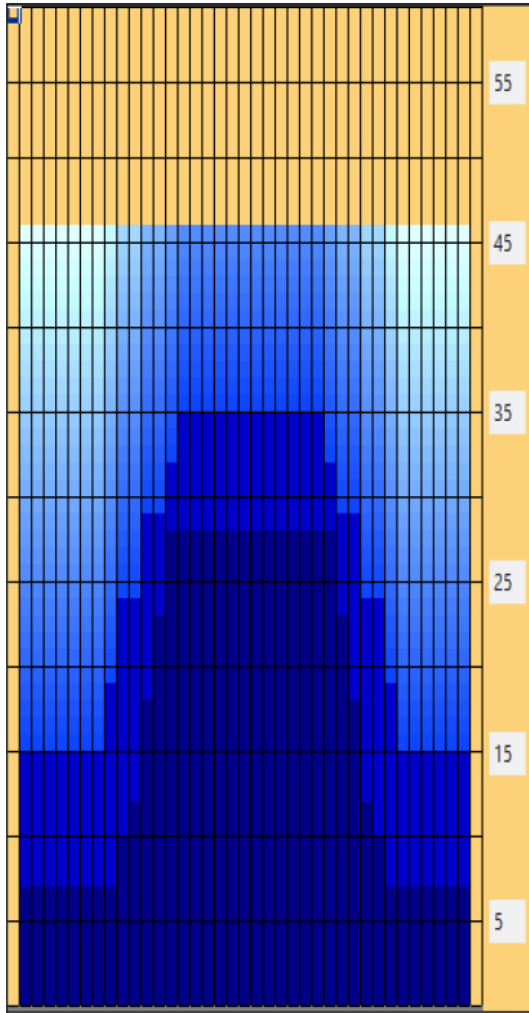

Description: *Long quasi-sport design*

Characteristics: *Asymmetrical high volume oil pattern with short back ends*

Recommended Attack Area: *Second Arrow/Down & In Approach*

Recommended Delivery Speed: *Moderate*

Equipment: *Strong with sanded surface*

Scoring Potential: *Medium to High* Difficulty: *Medium*

The EBT Panhandler 46' Pattern is longest of the EBT proprietary patterns. At 46 feet, bowlers should expect a minimal ball reaction, especially when fresh, and will need to adjust their speed and target accordingly. While the Panhandler is a quasi sport shot, it tends to score higher than almost all other EBT User patterns. The Panhandler does not allow for multiple attack lines, especially in early games because the oil volume and length limits the ball reaction. Be prepared to play a tighter line at first. Bowlers throwing weak equipment or those who have a weaker hand delivery will find this pattern extremely difficult. To compensate, lower skilled bowlers may consider playing off the corner and pointing the ball to the pocket. The pattern will open up allowing for more ball movement as the games prolong. The pattern is flatter and asymmetrical, but as it tapers, it also narrows which can cause bowlers to misread what the oil is actually doing. The asymmetry is very slight and should not be a large factor. Carefully read your equipment and what the lanes are telling you! In the end, you as the bowler are ultimately responsible for choosing the right equipment and playing the lanes as they allow you to play them! This is only a reference guide, not an answer key!
